A Stranger to Myself: Living with An Invisible Disability

In June 1982 I underwent a right frontal-temporal craniotomy for a congenital aneurysm just off the right internal carotid artery. The aneurysm ruptured just after the neurosurgeon had it sighted. Al-though I survived the event and although I could walk, talk and function in a somewhat normal fashion, I was changed, different in ways that I continue to discover even now after all these years. For me long- term memories are elusive, moving behind a veil that I cannot touch, cannot relive. Several years ago and courtesy of a Facebook mem, I learn the Welsh have a word for what I feel at times, *hiraeth*.
